This is our philosophy in working with families and child care providers. Over the past year we have continued to see the impacts of the economy, stress and trauma on those we serve. We have encountered many with nowhere to turn for support. The lack of accessible child care, finding and retaining qualified staff in child care programs, the loss of household income for increasing bills, lack of basic needs items and the impact of stress on child and adult behaviors were highly evident in supports and resources requested this year.

As parents had access to necessary basic needs- like our car seat, grocery, diaper and emergency support funds- they were able to focus on other needs for their families.

As parents and child care providers were empowered with knowledge and skills to manage child behaviors and assist growth and development- by participating in home visits, parent groups or provider training- their strengths fostered growth and lives improved.

On behalf of all of us at CFR -and the children, parents and caregivers supported hand in hand, we thank you for your generosity and partnership.

Online impact included: Our website, cfresources.org, received **5,425** website hits from **2,515** unique visitors. **7,673** total Facebook users were reached with **2,346** page visits.

Family Connection events held this past year included our "Mardi Gras", "Pinwheel" Events in each county, "Hey Y'all it's Fall" and "Summer Carnival" events.

Staff provided free activities, healthy snacks and crafts to 70 Children and 52 adults. Each of the 7 events included parent-child activities, time for parent connections, materials for projects, game ideas, and resource information.

- A total of **560** families were served through CFR's Family Resource Center programs with many accessing more than one service.
- 340 Home and supervised visits conducted with 70 adults through parent education skills program and supervised visitation services.
- 75 parenting education groups
- **52** Individual car seats were distributed with safety education by our state certified staff technicians.



Parenting education promotes the use of positive parenting practices, such as using positive language, planned discipline, and family routines. It also encourages nurturing behavior and increases parents' knowledge of child development and communication styles.

Parenting Services Continued



- 2 sessions of Families in Transition
 were offered to 8 parents to support
 & provide tools for positive
 co-parenting that strengthens
 children involved. In December 2023
 we discontinued offering this
 program due to several factors
 including; decreasing facility space,
 decreased demand for in-person
 sessions, funding to support the cost
 of delivery and staff availability to
 facilitate this program.
- The Children's Center at the Yates County Courthouse usage has increased annually since being severely affected by the the Pandemic. 18 Families and 41 children were supported through The Children's Center's free drop-in child care center for children whose families or caregivers have business in the Yates County Court. Referrals to other community services were also given to parents accessing The Children's Center.





- Supporting working parents by providing child care information, referrals and child care assistance program information.
 - 344 Families accessed needed child care referrals.
 - 474 Children were in need of child care via our contacts
 - Infant and Toddler care was the most frequent need requested.
 66% for Yates County
 51% for Ontario County
 61% for Seneca County
- 109(32%) Families served in the referral calls indicated they were eligible for the New York State Child Care Subsidy Program. (Now known as the Child Care Assistance Program)

Healthy Families Ontario, Seneca& Yates



- 2,271 Home visits were conducted by our Healthy Families Ontario, Seneca & Yates programs.
- This program provided support for obtaining pre-natal care, family worklife needs, child development, and parent child interactions.
- 128 families received weekly, bi-weekly, monthly or quarterly visits

Community Baby Shower events were held in each county. Parents were provided with helpful resource connections & infant supplies. Community agencies attended to share their information and resources with parents at these events.

- 20 Ontario families and 15 community partners
- 20 Seneca families and 12 community partners
- 18 Yates families and 9 community partners

Enrolled Families Special Events Included

- Fall Pick n Patch Day 54 adults and 23 children
- Dr. Seuss's Birthday collaboration with 6 library's in all 3 counties; 155 attendees

Child Care Program Services



- * Expanding & Strengthening the Child Care Community
- * Supporting Family Child Care Businesses With Resources
- * Promoting Quality Care via Technical Assistance, Training & Monitoring
 - 4,885 instances of basic technical assistance, health care consultancy and intensive technical assistance visits were provided to registered, licensed and legally exempt child care providers.
 - 510 individual Child Care Providers attended trainings offered by CFR. Many attending several sessions.
 - 98 Training sessions were offered to Child Care Providers via workshops, one-on-one sessions, series classes and virtual meeting classes
 - Child Care Centers received 6 sessions of onsite in-service training (92 staff trained)





- 62 Child Care Providers received individualized intensive technical assistance (ITA) in their programs to focus on their specific program needs and opportunities for quality improvements. They received 60.5 hours of service during 49 visits.
- 18 potential providers attended our training to become registered and 7 received grants to start up their family child care businesses.
 Legally Exempt child care providers were able to apply for grants, 6 were awarded.







- 43 child care providers participated in our state sponsored Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP), serving 150,472 nutritious meals to children.
 38 child care providers are currently enrolled with 379 children being served.
- 245 visits were conducted by CFR staff in our Child Care Registration, Enrollment and Inspection services to Family Based, School Age Child Care and Legally Exempt providers. 72 inspections were conducted with suspected illegal programs.
- As of August 2024 the number of Registered FDC and SACC programs per county were:
 Ontario-44, Seneca-14, Yates-9
- The number of approved Legally Exempt providers per county were:
 Ontario-66, Seneca-23, Yates-14
- These numbers do not include Licensed Child Care Centers or Group Family Child Care programs as these are overseen by OCFS Regional Office. These include: Ontario-32, Seneca-6, Yates-4
- Staff diligently worked to support 104
 programs with the OCFS Workforce
 Retention grants. These provided over
 2,484,722 dollars for salary bonuses and
 hiring incentives to child care workers. This
 also included additional trainings, TA visits,
 calls and one-on-one support to
 programs.
 - 75 Ontario County programs
 - 16 Seneca County programs
 - 13 Yates County programs






